Double-counting in the Foundations Program: Students are able to satisfy several Foundations Program requirements while completing their program of study in Italian. Students are encouraged to work closely with Italian faculty in order to plan a course of study and identify courses that count in both areas.

Prerequisites and language placement: Many students of Italian begin at level I, and students who have studied Italian previously or those with prior knowledge of Italian are placed at the appropriate level.
